CLEANING GUIDE

Outlets & Switches



IMPORTANT SAFETY WARNING

ALWAYS SWITCH OFF POWER AT THE MAINS BEFORE CLEANING.

Cleaning should never be attempted while switches or power points are live.

RECOMMENDED CLEANING PROCESS

Keeping your switches and power points clean helps maintain appearance, hygiene, and long-term performance.

Please follow these important guidelines when cleaning your Voltex switches and sockets.

- 1 Remove decorative cover if applicable.
- 2 Wipe with a soft, non-abrasive cloth lightly dampened with water only. Do not soak or over-wet the cloth. Avoid dripping or excess moisture.
- 3 **Never** use cleaning products or "Spray n Wipe" type cleaners on the cloth or directly on the product.
- 4 Wipe the faceplate and switches with a dry cloth afterwards to remove any remaining moisture.
- 5 Ensure everything is completely dry before restoring power.

FOR MATTE PRODUCTS AND PAINTED FINISHES

Matte and painted finishes require extra care. Avoid harsh rubbing or abrasive cleaning.

Avoid dragging appliance plugs which may mark the surface.

If marking occurs, use a white or clear gum pencil eraser gently to remove marks.



DOS

Use soft, non-abrasive cloths (microfiber recommended), lightly dampened with water only.

Clean regularly to prevent buildup.

Ensure the area is fully dry before use.



DON'TS

Do not spray liquids directly on switches, sockets, or nearby surfaces where splashing could occur.

Do not use abrasive cloths or pads that could scratch the surface.

Do not use harsh chemicals, solvents, alkaline cleaners or detergents. Do not use any cleaning products or sprays (including "Spray n Wipe" style cleaners) as these deteriorate and weaken the PC material, leading to future cracking.

Do not immerse, pressure wash, or soak cover plates or switches.

Do not wash cover plates in water over 60°C or painted covers over 40°C.

Do not put cover plates in a dishwasher.

Do not allow liquid to enter openings in the product.



CAUTION

Incorrect cleaning may damage the product, compromise safety, and void warranty. Some stains or marks may be permanent and not removable. If unsure or if excessive dirt or marking is present, consult Voltex or a qualified electrician before proceeding.
